Instructions

Many years ago a friend and mentor shared the importance of keeping a record of my Bible reading...not as a bragging right... but as a means of insuring that I read consistently and did not miss out on the portions of scripture that are not as exciting as others. Also, I would avoid neglecting certain portions. It has proven itself a worthy endeavor. Read just three chapters each day and five on Sunday to complete the reading in one year.

Place a "/" over the number of the chapter you read. When you read a chapter a second time place a "\" to form an "X". At times I have even circled it a third time and blacked it out a fourth. This helps us identify areas we spend more time in and areas we might be neglecting.

The ultimate purpose for reading the Bible is to know God, to know His will for our lives and to know the purpose for which he created us. You will find these things if you ask God to reveal Himself to you, if you seek His will, and if you knock at the doors of opportunity He brings before you.

Remember to read for the *message*... not the *mileage*!
